Today's wars are mainly civil wars (-) Wars between opposing groups of citizens of the country. And civil wars often last longer, leave the population more traumatized, and destroy countries more thoroughly than wars fought between nations. Civil wars are cruel, bloody operation that result in thousands of deaths, sexual assaults, forced exile and in the most extreme cases, genocide notes Spanish historian Julian Casanova. Indeed, when atrocities are committed by neighbor against neighbor, the wounds take centuries to heal.

What fuel the fires of such cruel wars? Ethnic and tribal hatred, religious differences, injustice, and political turmoil are all significant factors. Another root cause is greed-Greed for power and greed for money. Political leaders, often motivated by greed, stir up the hatred that fuels the fighting.
